

School Uniform, Equipment and Expectations Y7 to Y11 2025 - 26

Our students are extremely smart and we place high regard on their personal presentation and the way in which they wear their uniform. We value the full support that parents/carers give the school in ensuring that their child meets the uniform expectations and we expect our students to be in full uniform each day. It is the school's judgement on whether these expectations have been met. Students may be removed from lessons if they are not wearing the correct uniform or their hairstyle, makeup or jewellery does not meet with school expectations. If in any doubt always check with your Assistant Head of Year or School Office before making any changes to your child's uniform, nails or hair. In addition, it is vital for all property to be clearly marked with the student's name. In this way, lost property can be traced.

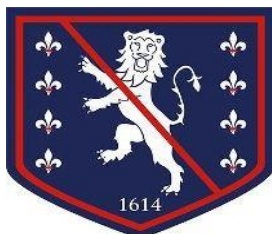

School Uniform

Compulsory items:

- ❖ SGS branded blazer with badge (to be worn at all times).
- ❖ White shirt.
- ❖ SGS tie - see colour chart below for specific year groups.

- ❖ SGS skirt or navy blue tailored trousers (no jeans, no leggings, no jeggings). Navy blue tailored shorts (*can be worn after the Easter school holidays, for every summer term that follows*).



- ❖ White ankle socks (no logos) **or** black tights can be worn with the school skirt (if a student needs to wear socks and black tights the socks must be entirely black and have no logo). Black socks to be worn with school trousers or shorts.
- ❖ Smart black leather footwear that can raise a shine (no material trainers even if they are black, no logos other than black, no canvas shoes, no high-heels and no boots). Leather, patent, lace up, velcro is absolutely fine. Examples of acceptable styles of shoe (not exhaustive):



Optional items:

- ❖ SGS branded jumper to be worn in conjunction with our blazer not instead (no hoodies, non school sweatshirts or jumpers).

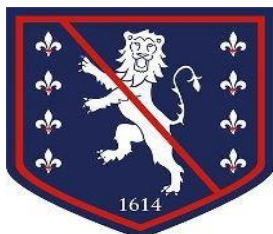


- ❖ Coat or waterproof to be worn over our blazer (Hoodies, sweatshirts, a zip up jumper/cardigan or tracksuit tops that cover the uniform are not appropriate outer coats).
- ❖ Winter hat, scarf or gloves when it is cold to be worn outside (not in corridors or in lessons).

KS3 PE Uniform

Compulsory items:

- ❖ SGS branded Navy PE Polo (boys or girls available).
- ❖ Navy PE Shorts or Navy Skort.
- ❖ SGS branded Navy Quarter Zip Top.
- ❖ Navy Football Socks or plain white socks.



Optional items:

- ❖ Navy Jogging Bottoms.
- ❖ Navy baselayer Leggings.
- ❖ SGS branded Navy Training Rain Jacket.
- ❖ Navy Baselayer (bought from any sports shop).

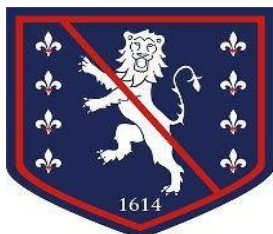


Y10 and 11 PE Uniform

As above but rather than purchasing the compulsory quarter zip top students can continue to wear their unbranded plain navy or black jumper or purchase the new branded version.

Equipment:

- ❖ Rucksack or Bag.
- ❖ Pencil case; pen, pencil, ruler, rubber, green pen.
- ❖ Maths equipment - scientific calculator, protractor, set square and compass.
- ❖ Reading book.



- ❖ Water Bottle.
- ❖ Ipad and Powerbank with a lead (students who do not own ipads are able to borrow one from the school when needed for lessons).

Speak to the appropriate Head of Year or Assistant Head of Year in confidence, if there are financial or other problems that prevent your child from having the correct uniform or equipment.

SGS Standards / Expectations

Uniform

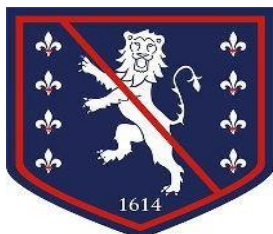
- ❖ Skirts are to be worn at their full length on purchase and not rolled up or altered. On the new skirts the logo must be visible.
- ❖ Shirts are to be tucked in at all times unless playing sports or active games at lunchtime or break time.
- ❖ Ties must be at a reasonable length no more than just short of their waistband.
- ❖ Uniform problems must be communicated to the school in one of two ways (letter from the parent brought by the student or via a parent email to the Assistant Head of Year - both methods should give the reason and the date of correction)

Hairstyle

- ❖ Hair should be natural in colour, pattern and style.
- ❖ Extreme hairstyles or unnatural hair colours are not permitted and the school will contact parents to agree to a timely resolution.

Makeup and Nails

- ❖ No make up, nail varnish or nail extensions (acrylics) at KS3
- ❖ Discreet makeup (natural look) and discreet nail varnish may be worn at KS4. No false eyelashes, nail extensions or acrylics.
- ❖ Where a student is unable to correct the problem in school they may be removed from the community until parents have been contacted and correction has been agreed.



Piercing and jewellery

- ❖ All facial piercings are prohibited and should be removed or a clear retainer/stud worn.
- ❖ One pair of ear studs only in the ear lobe (i.e. no hoops, drops, spikes or stretchers) and a watch are acceptable at KS3.
- ❖ Up to two ear studs in each ear (i.e. no hoops, drops, spikes or stretchers) are acceptable at KS4.
- ❖ Any piercings beyond this number in the ear lobe must have a clear retainer.
- ❖ We understand that at KS4 some students want to wear a necklace (worn inside the shirt) or single simple ring.
- ❖ The school accepts no responsibility for the loss of valuable jewellery at school.

iPads

- ❖ Brought everyday to school.
- ❖ Be fully charged when brought to school.
- ❖ Used for educational purposes only and should not be used at break or lunch unless in designated study areas.

Mobile phones and Headphones

- ❖ Students' mobile phones must be off, kept out of sight in bags and not used by students once crossing the blue lines on any of our teaching sites.
- ❖ Phones should not be seen, or heard, during school hours or at any time on site (this includes before and after school) or they will be confiscated.
- ❖ If a student uses their mobile phone during these times or it is visible it will be confiscated. Their parent/carer will need to arrange a time to collect the phone from the relevant school office at the end of the school day.
- ❖ If a student is wearing headphones during the school day they can expect to have their phone confiscated as headphones may be required with ipads for learning.
- ❖ Should parents / carers need to contact a student during the school day, this should be done via the main school reception and any necessary message can be relayed to the student. Equally, if there is a need for a student to contact home, this can (where reasonable to do so), be facilitated by school offices or the pastoral team at break or lunchtime.
